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Safety precautions



To be read attentively and acted accordingly before operating, performing maintenance or repairing the dust collector.

Special attention must be paid to all the framed safety text that begins with a warning symbol (Triangle) followed by a signal word, as shown below.

INTRODUCTION

- 2 Read and understand the warnings posted on the machine and in this manual.
- 3 Replace warning labels if they become obscured or removed
- 4 This dust collector is designed and intended for use by properly trained and experienced personnel only. If you are not familiar with the proper and safe

- operation of a dust collector, do not use until proper training and knowledge have been obtained.
- 5 Do not use this dust collector for other than its intended use. If used for other purposes, Chicago Pneumatic disclaims any real or implied warranty and holds itself harmless from any injury that may result from that use.
- 6 Always wear approved safety glasses/ face shield while using this dust collector
- 7 Keep hair, loose clothing, fingers, and all parts of body away from openings and moving parts.
- 8 Keep safety guards in place at all times when the dust collector is in use. If removed for maintenance purposes, use extreme caution and replace the guards immediately after maintenance is complete.



- 9 Check damaged parts. Before further use of the dust collector, a guard or other part that is damaged should be carefully checked to determine that it will operate properly and perform its intended function.
- 10 Check for alignment of moving parts, binding of moving parts, breakage of parts, mounting and any other conditions that may affect its operation. A guard or other part that is damaged should be properly repaired or replaced.
- 11 Provide adequate space surrounding for work area and non-glare, overhead lighting
- 12 Keep visitors at a safe distance from the work area. Keep children away.
- 13 Do not put any objects into the openings. Do not use dust collector with any opening blocked; Opening must be free of dust, lint, hair, and anything that may reduce air flow.
- 14 Use non recommended accessories; improper accessories may be hazardous.
- 15 Handle tools with care. Follow instructions for lubricating and changing accessories.

- 16 Turn OFF the dust collector and unplug it from power source before cleaning. Use a brush or compressed air to remove dust, chips or debris; do not use bare hands.
- 17 Do not stand on the dust collector. Serious injury could occur if the dust collector tips over.

GENERAL SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- 1 The owner is responsible for maintaining the unit in a safe operating condition. Unit parts and accessories must be replaced if missing or unsuitable for safe operation.
- 2 All regulating and safety devices shall be maintained with due care to ensure that they function properly. They may not be put out of action.
- 3 Keep the work area neat and clean. Lack of order will increase the risk of accidents.
- 4 Wear appropriate Personal Protective Equipments (PPE) depending on the kind of activities while operating the dust collector. Protect long hairs with a hairnet. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery.



GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The CDP 10 dust collector is intended for use with one hand-held Rock drill or Breaker with a proper attachments such as hose and appropriate suction hood attachments.

The ejector tube is located in a well-protected position inside the filter and the Housing-unit.


The dust collector has low weight, and is therefore easy to handle. It is set up by locating the tripod which is having foldable legs on the ground that keep the unit upright and stable if the ground is flat and not having slope. It can also be mounted on Chicago Pneumatic trolley.

The rock cuttings and dust particles that are sucked into the dust collector are collected into a sack. The sack is secured around the cyclone part of the filter unit by the sack holder.

The CDP 10 dust collector has high suction capacity to its air consumption.

FUNCTIONAL DESCRIPTION

Drive ejector

The drive ejector (4) is located inside the filter unit (5), and is thus well-protected from mechanical damage. By locating the ejector above the filters (5), an under pressure is maintained in the suction system. This eliminates the risk of dust leakage. Since only filtered air flows through the ejector, wear to the unit is minimal.

Collection system

The collection system consists of a suction hood (10) or tool holder (14) which is made of wear resistant material and it is attached with flexible suction hose (11). Other end of suction hose (11) is connected to suction pipe (9).


Filter unit

Filter mounted on filter support (6) with the help of fasteners. In filtration chamber larger particles are separated in the cyclone, while smaller particles are trapped by the filter.




Operating instructions

HOSE CONNECTION




- 1 Connect the compressed-air hose to the claw coupling on the cover (1).
- 2 Connect one end of suction hose (2) to suction hood or tool holder and another end to suction pipe (3) as shown in the above figure.

BEFORE STARTING



- 1 Pull the sack support (1) which is inside the housing unit (2) till it comes down completely.
- 2 Lock the sack support by tightening the four screws in housing (2), so that the bottom support does not get pulled in during operation.
- 3 Wrap the sack around sack support (1) and hold it tight around housing (2) with the help of adjustable belt (3) as shown in the above figure.

STARTING




- There is a 2 way ball valve mounted on cover (1).
- 2 To start the dust collector, turn the knob (2) to the starting position.



SACK REPLACEMENT

- 1 When the sack has been filled with 10-20 kg of drill cuttings, it must be changed.
- 2 First switch off the ejector by turning the ball valve "across" the air flow (i.e. at right angle to the air flow).

FILTER CLEANING



- 1 Do not remove the filter from the housing.
- 2 Turn the 2-way ball valve knob to cleaning position which will force the pressurized air to flow inside the filter and all dust accumulated on filter is collected in a sack.

MOVING THE DUST COLLECTOR

For specific instruction see below!



Do not carry the dust collector horizontally it may damage housing and filter.

If the distance is short, the housing unit is carried vertically.

If the distance is long, remove the suction hose from the filter unit and carry the unit vertically. Do not lift the dust collector with the tripod stands as it can damage the unit or deform the unit.

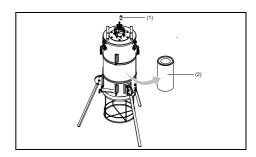
FILTER REPLACEMENT

- 1 Clean the filter (2) once the vacuum indicator (1) has reached the red line and then reset the vacuum indicator (1).
- 2 If the vacuum indicator (1) continuously shows the red line even after cleaning the air filter (2), wash the air filter (2) by water and filter should be properly dried before using in Dust Collector.
- 3 If the vacuum indicator (1) continuously shows the red line even after washing the air filter (2), replace the air filter



When suction inlet is closed completely, the vacuum indicator turns red.

So always consider the vacuum indicator reading when suction hood is open to atmosphere.



DRILLING IN WATER-BEARING ROCK



This dust collector should not be use in water-bearing rock.



Drilling at temperatures below 0°C



When drilling in temperatures below 0°C, the compressed air line must be equipped with a water separator. If this is not done, there is a risk of the drive ejector freezing up, with reduced suction capacity as a result. In extremely cold operating conditions, it may be necessary to connect an alcohol dispenser to the compressed air line.

TOOL HOLDER

To operate dust collector for breakers, tool holder needs to be connected on working tool.

Connect one end of suction hose to tool holder and another end to suction pipe of dust collector

Tool holder mounting instructions:

Tool holder is provided with adjustable spring for different sizes of working tool.

- 1. Fit bellow (1) to the tool holder (2).
- 2. Insert the tool holder (2) over working tool (3) till it touches the bottom of breaker (4).


- 3. For bigger diameter working tool adjust the spring (6) to position (5).
- 4. For Smaller diameter working tool, adjust the spring (6) to position (7).




Before operating the breaker, please make sure tool holder is tightly hold on working tool. If tool holder is not tightly hold, it may slide down the working tool.



If working tool (3) tip is not below the bellow(1), cut the bellow (1) to the required length.








SUCTION HOOD

To operate dust collector for Rock Drill (1), suction hood needs to be connected on working tool.

Connect one end of suction hose to suction hood and another end to suction pipe of dust collector.

Suction hood mounting instructions:



- 1. Insert working tool (2) inside the suction hood (3).
- Two flap supports are provided on suction hood.

3. During operation the operator needs to keep his/her legs on the flaps (4), so that suction hood (3) is always at ground surface (5).



During operation, please make sure the suction hood always in contact with ground surface, so that entire dust gets collected through suction hood.




Parts shall only be replaced by genuine Chicago Pneumatic replacement parts.



Disassembly of the filter unit

- 1. Loosen the clamping lock (1) at housing (2).
- 2. Remove filter unit with the help of handle provided on top of filter support (3).
- 3. Remove the filter (4) from support by unscrewing the Nut.
- 4. Assembly is carried out in reverse order. Make sure that the filters are moderately but sufficiently tightened.





Problem solving

Problem: Reduced suction effect.

Possible faults	Corrective actions
Clogged filter	Clean the filter
Damp cuttings have blocked the suction hose	Clean out the suction hose by starting the ejector and then striking the hose carefully
Freezing the ejector	Pour approx. 100 ml of carburettor spirits into the inlet of the ejector. Check carefully the water separator is working properly
Dirt in ejector. (Shine a torch through the ejector to check for dirt)	Remove the ejector from the filer unit. Carefully clean out the dirt. Take care not to damage or deform the nozzle

Problem: Ejector does not start.

Possible faults	Corrective actions
The compressed air hose is not connected to the dust collector	Connect-up the compressed hose
Freezing in dust collector air system	Warm-up the parts carefully

Problem: Dust in Exhaust air.

Possible faults	Corrective actions
Filter damaged	Replace damaged filters
Filters not correctly attached	Fit and fasten correctly




